Advocacy vs Self-Advocacy















- Little uplift in funding.
- Higher demand on providers.
- More crisis advocacy.
- Family court advocacy.



- Pooling of budgets.
- Threat to LD specific advocacy.
- Inconsistent natural picture.
- Inconsistent funding.



- Advocacy Services delivered in an adhoc way.
- Grant availability vs needs.
- Recruitment and retention of staff.



- Early intervention and prevention.
- Lower-level support that could reduce the requirement for formal advocacy.
- Specialist advocacy for people with complex or multiple needs.



 Specialist advocacy for people who are firstlanguage Welsh speakers or who have diverse cultural backgrounds and associated language requirements.





- Specialist advocacy for people who are pre-verbal, and/or who require aides and adaptations to promote communication.
- Specialist advocacy for people in complex situations, such as specialist services, prison services, other secure services, or going through court proceedings; and
- Different types of advocacy, such as peer-advocacy, citizenadvocacy, or informal advocacy.



Self-Advocacy?



- Advocacy Grant Scheme ends in Wales.
- SSWB Wales Act supposed to replace this.
- Project led vs member led.
- · IPA Contracts.

Self-Advocacy?



- SA not funded but is blurred into SLA's.
- Negative outcomes for those with more complex needs (noninstructive advocacy).
- Expectation to deliver services outside the realm of advocacy.
- Causing a blurring of what advocacy is supposed to be.

The Consequences



- Reduction in advocacy services.
- Recuction in LD specific support in advocacy services.
- Forced dependence on advocacy services.
- Increase in vulnerability for people with learning disabilities.

The Consequences



- Reactive vs preventative approaches.
- Reduction in skills for pwlds to be active citizens in Wales.
- Decrease in co-production in Wales.
- Reliance on others to speak for us/increasing stigmatization.





- Every £1.00 spent on advocacy created £12.00 of benefits.
- This means for every £1.00 spent on advocacy we save the NHS £7.00 and Local Authorities £5.00.
