We worked with people in Wales to make a fun way for people with learning disabilities to discuss and share their thoughts about their adult lives

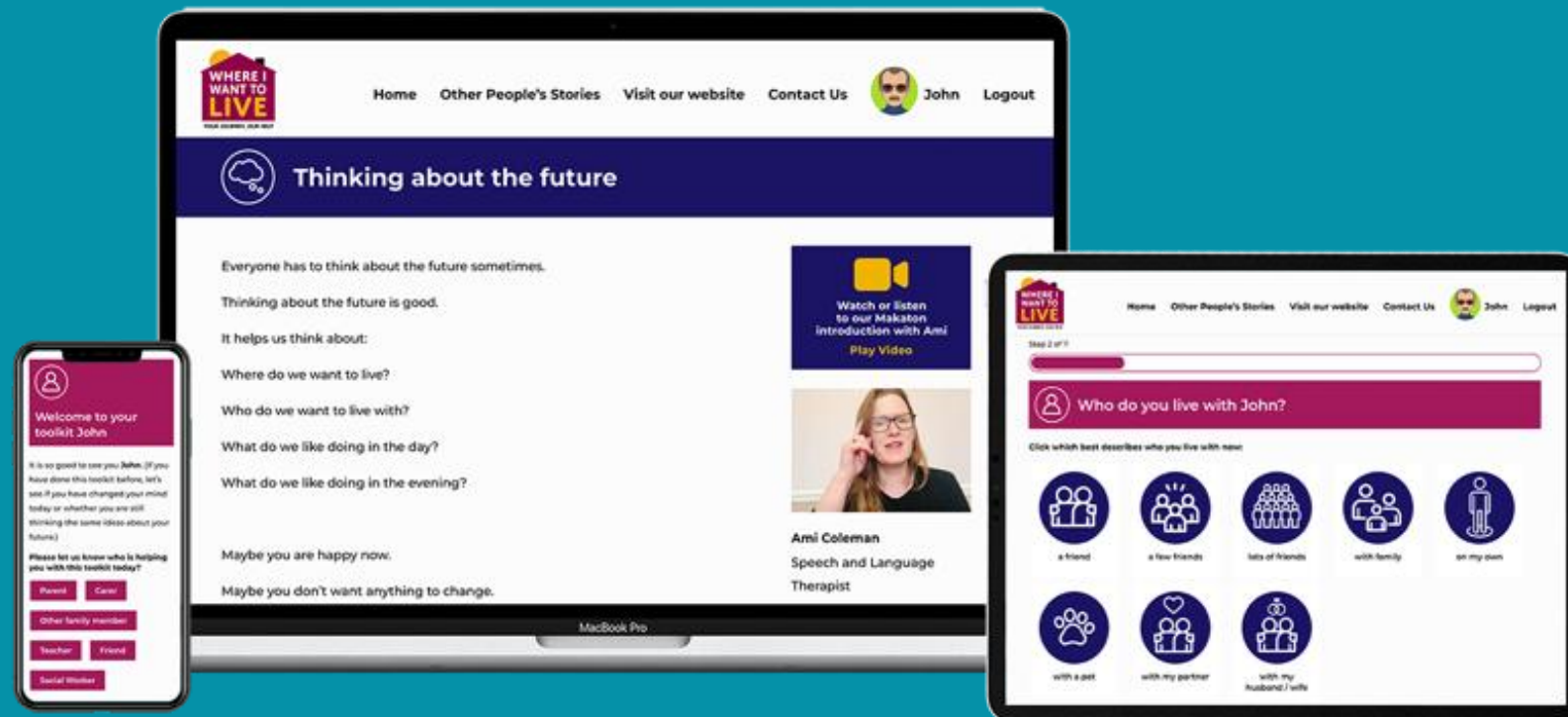
We worked with...

- Young people, aged 14 to 35 years, with learning disabilities
- Families
- Local Authority – social care and commissioning
- Housing providers
- Health Boards
- PHW
- Education providers
- Care providers
- Advocacy services

Findings...

The project demonstrated that an engaging digital toolkit can empower people with a learning disability to understand their options and express their wishes about where and how they live their adult lives.

The first version of this co-produced digital toolkit is ready to be used...




About the toolkit...

- It gets the conversation started
- You are in control
- It is good to use the toolkit even if you don't want to move at the moment
- It reminds you that changing your mind is okay
- You can use it as often as you like
- Lots of different people can help you
- Because it is on the internet you always have a record of what you said
- Having a record of what you said might help you when you use it again

An intended consequence...

- An information bank of the needs and wishes of young people with learning disabilities expressed by themselves
- Over time a significant resource for those involved in the provision of care, education and housing
- Evidence to plan and deliver services

Findings...

- **Co-production** is a highly effective way to create a toolkit that is **person centred** and **sustainable whilst complementing the objectives of personal and professional support networks**
- The **third sector** is an **effective vehicle** for managing such projects as the focus is wholly on the person-centred vision, **without other service pressures**



The biggest challenge...

- Despite unanimously positive feedback regarding the need and appetite for the toolkit, it has been a challenge for the workforce to embed this person-centred approach i.e. change existing working practices
- From crisis management to also focusing on long term provisioning and planning
- This requires data
- Gathering data requires ALL stakeholders to be actively involved
- All have either a practical, moral or legal reason to do so!

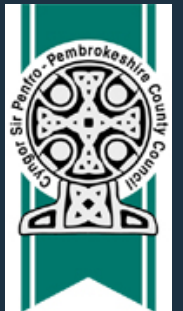
