- 2. Support the Stolen Lives campaign. To get people with a learning disability out of mental health hospitals and back into their communities.**



- 3. Help people with a learning disability get jobs. By making sure they can have a job coach and supported employment if they need it.**



4. Make sure more people with a learning disability have a good annual health check.



5. Give parents with a learning disability better support. So that they can look after their children safely.



6. Make sure people with a learning disability can have friends and relationships. Make it easier for them to go out in their local communities when they want to.



7. Make sure organisations that work with people with a learning disability and their families have enough money to give good support.
