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Choosing the right tool

There are **3** tools in this pack.

Look at the document you want to check.



Is this a letter?

Use the red tool called Letters

Is this a leaflet?

Use the purple tool called Leaflets



Is this the Easy Read version of a big document, like a report or consultation?

Use the green tool called Easy Read versions





What is in each tool?

Each tool has:

- a list of instructions
- sets of questions
- instructions on how to score
- a score sheet



You need a new set of questions and a new score sheet for each document.



You can photocopy the sheets in this pack. You can print copies from the DVD that comes with this pack.



You can ask Learning Disability Wales to email you the sheets.
