

# Question 1: Not having enough time with your doctor



Patients tell us they do not have enough time to talk to their doctor.



Our advice says when you don't have much time with your doctor, you could:


talk to nurses or healthcare assistants



read leaflets or look at websites



 go to meetings to talk to other people with the same health problems as you.



## Question 2: Helping patients to make decisions



All patients should be as involved as they want to be in decisions about their treatment and care.



We say doctors should:

write things down for the patient



 let the patient record what the doctor says on their phone



 let the patient bring a friend or carer with them



 give the patient information in a place and at a time when they find it easier to understand and remember it



 find out about the patient - what is really important to them? What upsets them?



 give the patient time to think and talk about the choices.
