

# **About Learning Disability Wales**

Learning Disability Wales was created in 1983. We are a national charity, recognised as the combined voice of learning disability in Wales, bringing together people with a learning disability themselves, family carers and third sector providers.

We work in partnership with a wide range of public authorities, agencies and other non-governmental organisations.

We want all people with a learning disability to live as independently as possible in a place that they choose, to have control over their lives and be contributing citizens.

### Our mission is to:

'Create a Wales that values and includes every child, young person and adult with a learning disability'.

### **Our Values**

Our 'Statement of Key Rights and Values' for children, young people and adults with a learning disability, was shaped by the views of our members.

In brief the statement says:

We believe that as a child, young person or adult with a learning disability, you have a right to:

- Be valued and respected.
- Services and support to live a meaningful life.
- Education and training.
- Be seen, heard and informed.
- Plan your own life as you grow up.
- Friendships, relationships and a good social life.
- Employment.

Our statement reflects the commitment of Learning Disability Wales to the full implementation of Welsh and UK wide legislation and policy, within the framework of the All Wales Strategy and the overarching:

 UN Convention and Declaration on the Rights of the Child

### and

 UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, and associated European Conventions.

### Our goals are to

- Strengthen the voice, rights and status of children, young people and adults with a learning disability and/or autism.
- Support parents and family carers.
- Promote person centred services.



# Our projects, project partners and funders

### **Valued Lives**

The Valued Lives project, funded by Welsh Government, provides a range of complementary activities to inform, train, innovate, represent and challenge.





# **Engage to Change**

Engage to Change works with 800 employers to help 1,000 young people with a learning disability and/or autism to develop their employment skills through paid work placements. Funded by The National Lottery Community Fund in partnership with Welsh Government.







### **Love Life**

Funded by the European Union's Erasmus+ programme, this project is developing a training programme on relationships and sexuality aimed at supporting staff and family carers across Europe, led by trainers with a learning disability.





# **Working Together with Parents Network**

A partnership project working to improve the support for families where one or more parent has a learning disability. Funded by the Esmée Fairbairn Foundation.





## **Gig Buddies**

Funded by First Choice Housing, Gig Buddies is a befriending scheme that matches people with a learning disability and/or autism in Cardiff with volunteers who share the same interests, so they can go to gigs and events together.


