
At first, I felt nervous about starting a new job.

I'm not afraid to ask for help because....


I know that they understand my disabilities and focus on my abilities.

"I found that if you are honest about what you struggle with, talk about how you cope with situations and how you do things, your employer will help you."






Hi. My name is Sian Andrews and I have Autism.

I really like admin work and I continue to learn new things.




One thing that helps me in work, is knowing who to ask for help. Sometimes the computer doesn't work, but I don't let this stop me.
